CMP FEBRUARY BOOT CAMP FUN SHOOT

The RCS CMP group will host a Special **“Boot Camp” Fun Shoot** on **Saturday, January 25, 2018**. The Fun Shoot will be from 10:00A to 2:00P on the RCS North Pistol range and 100/200 yard rifle range. Format, equipment and special rules are as follows:

Scenario: You and some of your buddies have answered Uncle Sam's call after a foreign attack on the good old USA. You've each met all of the requirements to graduate Boot Camp, but you now have to qualify with rifle & pistol.

Rifle & sights: Shooters may participate with **any military-type rifle (e.g. AR-15, Garand, M1-A1, 1903 Spfld, etc.) firing a military (center-fire) caliber, equipped with iron sights**. Ten (10) shots will be fired at 200 yds. from a **standing, off-hand position**, and Ten (10) shots will be from a **prone position**. Both strings will be “slow-fire”, five (5) minutes per string. No formal “sighter” rounds will be fired.

Pistol & sights: Shooters may participate with **any handgun firing a military (center-fire) caliber (e.g. 45 acp, 9mm Luger, etc.), equipped with iron sights**. Twenty (20) shots will be fired from a **standing, off-hand position**, in ten (10) minutes, at Twenty-five (25) yards. No formal “sighter” rounds will be fired.

Qualification: The following scores will qualify as follows:

	Rifle	Pistol
Marksman	110 to 139	110 to 139
Sharpshooter	140 to 169	140 to 169
Expert	170 or more	170 or more

Fees: Entry fee is \$5.00 for RSC Members, and \$7.00 for Non-Members.

Special Rules and Safety: All activities on the range will be under the supervision and control of a Range Officer. The Range Officer will conduct a safety briefing prior to beginning the first relay of the day and at such other times as is deemed appropriate.

Any accidental or intentional discharge striking within 100 feet of the firing line, striking the overhead baffles or passing over the berm will result in disqualification from the match.

A chamber flag must be inserted whenever an rifle is removed from its case, whether racked or on the firing line, and may be removed only as directed by the Range Officer.
