Ray and Sue Klein and Mark and Amanda Eldred were accepted as new members – motion by Mike Roche supported by Dave DeVries – motion passed.

Bill Blain's wife passed away recently. Our thoughts and prayers are extended to him and his family.

With apologies to Vincent Ferrarese the date for the Adopt-A-Road clean up is Saturday, April 19th. The wrong date was listed in month's minutes.

The club did well with the food collection project at the sport show. This counts toward our annual competition of Sportsmen Against Hunger. We were credited with 36 man hours and there was over 10,000 pounds of food collected.

President's report – George not present this evening.

Vice-President's Report: Gordon Pickerd - The club is looking for project leaders for the following important projects.

- Ceiling in club needs to be replaced and reinsulated, the 100 yard and berm in the cowboy bowl needs to be finished, the tree that was planted in Wendell Brigg's memory has died and needs to be replaced (Gordon has a couple of trees that can be transplanted), the lawn tractors need to be serviced and made ready for the summer, a chairman is needed for the rifle venue for the Meijer State Games (this is a one day event), and help will be needed for our gardens around the club. Please contact Gordon or any Board member if you are able to help with these projects or if you would be willing to head up one of these projects.
- Bob Middlebrook will be installing an LED light on the north side of the clubhouse to illuminate the parking lot. This will be on a timer and will save the club a lot of money over what we are using now.
- Be sure to review the club rules regarding range use. These are posted at the entrance to the ranges. Everyone is responsible for range safety.
- There are two \$250 dollar scholarships available for students attending college. First choice will be given to students entering some type of natural resources curriculum. Students need to send a letter requesting a scholarship to the club and a committee will decide who gets these grants.

This part of the project should be completed by mid April.

- Trap/Skeet is opened every Sunday from 10 AM on and every Monday and Thursday evening starting at 6 P.M.. Winter League continues and you may still join this shoot.. Shooting will be on Sunday from 10-3 and Monday and Thursday from 6-9. Spring league begins April 14th.
- NSSA Wednesday night events continue on the first Wednesday of each month. Next one is April 2nd.
- NSSA shoot on April 12th and 13th rifle range closed.

- Hunter safety has 58 students signed up so far. Dates are April 21 st, 23 rd, and all day Saturday April 25 th. Help is needed particularly on Saturday afternoon. Please call Bill Skallos if you would like to help. (see more information on the next page)
- Cowboys reported 7 shooters for the March Old Coot Shoot and 14 shooters for the March 1st regular match. Eye and ear protection are required for participants and spectators.
- Wednesday, April 16th IDPA begins 6:00 PM Cowboy bowl.
- May 8th small bore bench shoot begins 2nd and 4th Thursday each month.
- Our JOAD program has now moved to their new building. This should be open to the public soon.
- MUCC District 5 Tim Hall represented the club and reported that the DNR representative at the meeting indicated there was a large loss of deer and turkey due to the harsh winter. License fees have changed. Tim asked about MUCC helping us with our tax free status (which we have had for years) and the response was that MUCC was reluctant to act on this due to so many clubs now property tax free and any action that MUCC took could affect their status.
- Apparel Many RSC shirts will be available for sale at the next regular meeting.
- The annual tree give-away will happen either May 10th or 17th depending on the weather. Help is needed at Van's Pines to distribute seedlings to other MUCC clubs starting at around 9:00 AM and finishing around 1:30 PM. Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by Chairman Barbara Blough. Tim Hall gave the invocation.

Report #1

- By-Law committee update Steven Mitchell Presented to the Board information about membership type and count (total 369 members), meeting attendance by year and month for 2011-2014. Also meeting attendance (2013 39% attended no meetings, 29% attended 1-3 meetings and 32% attended 4 or more meetings. *Secretary's note: what would be your suggestion to improve these numbers? Send to Steven Mitchell or give it to George at a regular meeting.
- The newsletter is sent to 189 members and emailed to 180 more. Those folks who have an email address will be getting a notice soon that their newsletter will be coming by email a huge savings as it now costs over \$1,500 a year to mail out these newsletters. More information to come.

Report #2

• Audio/Visual Improvement Committee – Steven Gardner – Progress is being made and the committee welcomes Curt Becker and Ben Schnepp who have offered to help with the wiring. Steve reported that the audio/visual project is about 85% done and under budget. It will be ready to go by Monday, April 21st in time for Hunter Safety- Great Job guys!!!!!

Business Items

Three bids were obtained and will be turned into our insurance company to assist us in paying for the new ceiling needed in the old part of the club house. It was decided to have members work on taking down the old ceiling and replacing the drywall. Thanks in advance! The insulation will be improved in this area as well as improvements to the old electrical system. A report will be given at the next regular meeting about the cost to the club for all the repair and new insulation that will be a big improvement over what we have now.

The rifle range backers are falling down. These need to be repaired by this Saturday for the CMP event. Planning is in the works for removable target stands (much like the ones on the 50 yard range) for the 200 yard range.

Officer's Reports

<u>President</u> – George talked about a Scholastic Pistol Shooting project. The club will be looking for someone interested in taking on this project. Information will be in the newsletter.

A club brochure is in the works. Peter Kreutzfeldt, Jim Jones and Scott Albini have put together a draft which the Board reviewed. Since much of the information came from our website it is apparent that that information needs to be updated. George will contact Peter about some updates. More to come.

Tom Smith has been working hard on the scholarship program. Rockford Schools offered to handle our scholarship funds providing the scholarship go to a Rockford Student. They also wanted to have the scholarship to be in the amount of \$500. After much discussion – a motion was made to allow Rockford Schools to handle this. This motion was defeated in a 7/5 vote. It was finally decided to advertise in our newsletter as well as the Rockford Squire that a scholarship is available and that students from all schools in the area are invited to apply.

<u>Vice President</u> — As mentioned above, Gordon has been getting bids and ideas on how to improve and repair our ceiling area with increased insulation and heat duct wrap. Terry also got two bids to help with estimating the final cost of all the repairs needed.

<u>Secretary</u> – Terry – asked if the club will need the big target butts that the outdoor archery was using. Bill Skallos indicated that we should probably keep 3 or 4. With the remainder it was suggested that they be sold and the money used to help with the building repair project. This could raise over a thousand dollars which would help pay part of the ongoing repair project. It was mentioned again that JOAD archery is completely gone to the new archery facility and they will be taken off the calendar. All archery events (except Bill's indoor winter league) will be held at the 10 mile facility.

<u>Treasurer</u> – Len – As of 4/15/2014 Total Income for April was \$32,046.00. Total Expenses \$\$3,676.48. Net ordinary income \$-\$1,630.48. It was noted that most of the expenses for the month had to do with the Audio/Visual improvements. A detailed report is available from the treasurer at every regular meeting if you wish to look over the books. The secretary also has a copy for the official records.

Income – Jan. 1, 2014-April 15, 2014...\$21,425.00 (-\$4,500.00 short of budgeted income) Expense-Jan. 1, 2014-April 15, 2014....\$14.495.00 (\$916.00 over budgeted expenses)

Sgt. At Arms – Dan Vincent - announced that a clay target delivery is set for this Thursday, April 17th at 4:30 PM. There are 20 skids of targets coming that need to be put away. The cost for these is \$10,331.75. A replacement pallet jack has been purchased as the old one has finally given up the ghost.

Trustee Reports

<u>Dan Hankinson</u> - stay tuned for the exact date of the tree give-away. The date depends on what the weather will be in the next few weeks.

<u>Dave DeVries</u> had no formal report but contributed to the general discussions.

Steve Gardner – Steve reminded the Board that our annual Rimfire Challenge has been scheduled to occur on May 10th. Steve thanked Jim Ruder for setting up a Pay Pal arrangement for this event. He also added a thank you for the NSSF website addition. CMP is set for this Saturday the 19th of April which is the start of the summer league.

<u>Tim Hall</u> will be our MUCC representative for the next District 5 meeting. He is going to investigate which clubs are 501 C3 organizations and which are 501 C4 organizations and report back to the Board.

<u>Bill Skallos</u> – Next hunter's safety starts Monday evening April 21st. There are <u>89 already signed up</u>. Help is needed all three days – Monday and Wednesday evening and Saturday all day. The other 2014 dates are on the calendar

<u>Steven Mitchell</u> – Presented a new idea to help with membership. The committee working on the bylaws revision has come up with a new position that will greatly assist the club in regards to keeping track of membership. The position will be called the Membership Secretary and will help the Treasurer with transfer of dues among other duties. This will be presented to the membership in the future as a part of the update of By-laws. (As Secretary I have a proposed copy of what they are thinking about if you wish to look it over.

<u>Mike Roche</u> brought to the attention of the Board new members – Mike made a motion to accept these folks as new members supported by Len Laitila. Motion approved.

General announcement – The range improvement projects this spring will follow this order – complete the rifle range, improvements to the South pistol range, then the major project on the North pistol range.


