Have you been to the club this past month? When the rain takes a break lots of activities are happening. Several members have been working on improving the insulation in areas that were less than needed to avoid the ice buildup that occurred last winter. This will also lower our heating and cooling costs.

Some of the things on this page are in addition to the normal events, like Ric Zimmerman and Gordon Pickerd moving the gravel back into the drive (I guess that is why they call rain storms "gully washers") There was a significant drop off on the right side that has been corrected.

The grass and gardens are in very nice shape. All the work in these areas is appreciated. Usually this time of year the dry-up starts but landscaping is still looking fine.

A group from Michigan Retrieving Dogs came out for the day on Sunday the 20th and spent their time shooting trap and skeet. About 50 men, ladies and kids shot 72 combined lines during the day and had a place for their dogs to run after the shooting was done.

An off-site MUCC event was attended by a five member RSC team to shoot 2 lines of both trap and skeet at the West Walker Sportsman's Club. The team took 1st place in the class B skeet event and had the 1st place Junior in the combined trap and skeet score. The team consisted of Dan Hankinson 46-45, Kevin Kubiszewski 45,44. Gordon Pickerd 44-43, George Mayhak 45,38 and Junior Collin Pickerd 34-29. Skeet scores are posted first followed by the tram scores. As a side note (no award) the RSC team came in second in Class B trap five targets behind the winner. There were 17 teams entered in the MUCC shoot.

Discussions by the MUCC district officers will be addressed at their September meeting (held at RSC) to improve promotion of future annual shoots. Tim Hall is the RSC representative at the district meetings.

Our August meeting coincides with the primary election on the same day. If you can attend the meeting after voting (in person or absentee) we will be happy to see you. If you don't make the meeting, still try to exercise your voting privilege.

The revised by-laws should be ready for a vote at the upcoming meeting.

Vice-President's Report: Gordon Pickerd – The check (\$4,091.50) from the insurance company has arrived and will help with the completion of the ceiling in the main building – the insulation will happen soon. The main heat duct overhead will need to be resealed (the Board will act on this at the next Board meeting) and there is a quantity of trash in the ceiling area that needs to be removed.

The \$500 scholarship was awarded to Patrick Bos, who plans on attending Aquinas College with a major in Environmental Science. He had an outstanding high school career with glowing letters of recommendation from teachers and administrators.

Work continues on the rifle range with a new beam across the range to be installed soon and berm work continues. Help is always needed and appreciated.

On the 50 yard rifle range – work will be done to lower the range from about 4 feet to 2 feet to even the targets with the cement pads. This will help keep our bullets from leaving the range.

MUCC has decided to work with the legislature to come up with wording to help clubs statewide either become or remain tax exempt. More information to come...

Len made use of our new video system to highlight areas of the budget to show performance of our different venues. Unfortunately, our video system which is supposed to show the folks running the meeting these items is not hooked up yet and I did not catch the amounts for each venue. It appears as if everything is pretty much on target with income as predicted and expenses under control. Please see Len if you have any questions.

Sergeant at Arms: Dan Vincent – absent this evening – however Gordon reported that Dan is looking into a combination lockset for the shoot building to allow associate members access to a bathroom as they do not have a key (and also access to a telephone if one is needed).

These bylaws will be presented to the membership at the August Regular Meeting – to be approved they must be voted on and approved at 2 out of 3 regular meetings.

Trustee Reports

2014 FLY HUNT

ROCKFORD SPORTSMANS CLUB 11115 Northland Drive Rockford, MI

LEGAL EQUIPMENT: For the 25 yard fly hunt, any .22 caliber or smaller rimfire hunting rifle or handgun may be used. Scopes must be 12x power or smaller than for the hunting. You may have a larger scope on your rifle, but it must be set to 12x power or less.

HUNTING POSITION: All shots may be fired from any shooting position, including bench rest with bipods or sand bags front & rear. Hunters and shooters that do not have their own bench — you may use one of the club benches, if they are available. First come, first served. Hunt time will be 3 hours. If we have more teams than space for them, we will shoot in 2 hour relays. We will draw for teams to hunt in relay #1. At the start of relay #2, the baits of relay #1 will be removed, and relay #2 teams will put their bait out.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: No alcoholic beverages are allowed during the hunt.

DATE: August 16, 2014

SHOOTING TIME: The hunt will begin at 12:00 PM and will end at 3:00 PM.

All firearms are to be unloaded and actions open.

Once the hunt has started, no one will be allowed to go down range until the hunt is over. Any sighting in will be done during your relay time.

LUNCH will be available. AWARDS will be after the shooting is done.

THINK SAFETY AT ALL TIMES.

BAITING: Your baits may be placed at your hunt area anytime. Any bait material may be used at the hunter's/ shooter's discretion. The bait must fit in a margarine tub style container. A bait platform will be placed at the proper height for the bait containers to sit on, but the top of the bait pile must be below the hunting area. Nothing may be attached (decoys are permitted), applied, or smeared, inside the hunting area except bullet holes and flies. **No shots may be fired into the bait bucket**. While this practice may stir the bait and increase fly activity, it will also spray nasty bait material around the range and on the target backers, which will have to be handled when the hunt is over. When the hunt is over, hunters will put their bait bucket into a posthole that has been dug for this purpose. The standard bait containers will be provided; so all containers will be same size.

HUNTING/SHOOTER PARTNERS: This is a two-person team event; with one shooting and the other spotting. Taking turns shooting and spotting if they choose to. The person spotting keeps scores for the team, maybe with some input from the shooter.

COUNTING LEGAL KILLS: Killing shots made outside of the hunting area (State Land) will not be counted. If a beast is sitting on the edge of the property when the shot is made the bullet hole must touch the property border and some of the splatter must hit on the property in order for the kill to count. No extra points will be awarded for any species of fly. Horseflies, houseflies, deer flies, fruit flies, yellow jackets, wasps, and just plain big old ugly flies will all count the same. Dragonflies and butterflies are both protected species, and taking them without a Federal Fly Stamp will not be permitted. There is no limit to the number of shots that may be fired during a hunt. There is no extra credit given for the highest percentage of kills with the fewest shots. A hunter shooting 100 shots making two kills will beat a hunter firing two shots with only one kill. Killing game on neighboring State Land or neighbor's hunt area will be considered poaching and is illegal and considered unsportsmanlike conduct.


100 YARD SHOOT: This is open to any paid shooter willing to try it. No bait required.

This is a timed fire match. Shooter is allowed 10 rounds. Any gun .22 caliber rimfire or smaller and any sighting system is acceptable. The first relay will begin at 10:00 am.

COST: The entry fee for each hunter/shooter will be \$10.00. (No more burgers)

In the case of a tied number of kills, (or in the event of NO kills) a shoot-off will be held. The shoot-off target will be a National Standard Ten Fly Target at 25 yards. The team with the best bait will be awarded the coveted MASTER BAITER award.
