## September 2<sup>nd</sup> Regular Meeting – Discussion of New Bylaws – 2<sup>nd</sup> vote will be taken

New members - (Motion by Mike Roche supported by Jim Lund - approved) We welcome new members Mike and Becky Berrevoets, Jerry and Judy Rice, Denise and Tim Sheets, and Charles Dean.

Safety Concern – Do not leave rifle or pistol on shooting bench with the action closed. All actions must be left open and firearms are empty with magazines removed when changing targets, returning to a vehicle to retrieve an item, etc.

Sportsmen Against Hunger—Over 4 and ½ million meals have been provided by our participation in the Sportsmen Against Hunger campaign over the past 10 years. #### President's report: George Mayhak:

The turkey contest and fish contest winners were announced. They are;

#### Treasurer's Report: Len Laitila:

Income for July \$7,308.65 – Total Expenses for July \$9,598.14 (Property tax was \$7,101.74 of the total expense paid in July – Net Income for July -\$2,289.49.

A detailed report is available – see Terry or Len. Defensive Pistol (\$735), Rockford Regulators (\$741) Hunter Safety (\$300) Pistol League (\$70) CMP (\$47) Trap/Skeet/5-Stand (\$1,194) These are some examples of shooting income for the month of July.

**Sergeant at Arms: Dan Vincent** – Dan reported that a combination lockset for the shoot building to allow associate members access to a bathroom as they do not have a key (and also access to a telephone if one is needed) has been completed. Meeting called to order at 7:10 PM by Chairman Barbara Blough. Tim Hall gave the invocation.

#### Officer's Reports:

President – Patrick Boss – our scholarship winner received his check.

#### Vice President -

The air ducts will be put up soon, the South shooting field may be started anytime by interested parties – targets lowered and a cover (bullet stop) placed over the targets. Member Steve Falarski will be putting up the insulation soon in the clubhouse where the new drywall was installed. Beams are ordered and ready to be picked up for the continuation of the 200 yd. range safety project. We are waiting on a larger crane to put the beams in place. Some work will need to be done at the end of the 200 yard rifle range to lower the targets a bit. This work will not interfere with any existing shooting events planned for that area. The total area to be lowered is approximately 20 X 30 feet and this will need to be lowered and leveled out about 9 to 15 inches.

Gordon reported that he and George Mayhak will attend a meeting next Monday concerning the 2017 State Games. They are looking at the North Grand Rapids/Rockford area as one of four possible sites for these upcoming games. Gordon also reported that the South Range project (covered berm) is ready to be started. All materials are available and as soon as someone volunteers to head up this project the telephone poles that will support such a covered structure will be put in place. Materials have been donated for the cover.

#### **Trustee Reports:**

<u>Dan Vincent</u> – suggested that all shooting venues either request set-up time or start their event  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour later than posted. 
