Our winter quarter is coming to a conclusion and the first quarter wild game (fish) contest will end at the April 7 meeting. There are several entries already. Be sure to bring in your pictures of your catches for cash awards. Next quarter there should be more fish entries along with Wild Turkeys. If you like to be in the outdoors the weather should be cooperating since the calendar says it is Spring time.

The Winter League finished with a banquet at the club house Thursday evening March 26. This year we had 14 trap and 13 skeet entries in the Junior classification for the Rockford Public Schools. These targets will move when hit and will not produce deflections since the bullet is absorbed and the hole sealed from the heat. This will give target shooters more to shoot at than paper and will move as they are hit. If the trial of the first purchase is favorable, they can be ordered for all the ranges. Hopefully we can continue to eliminate shooting at unauthorized trinkets.

Hope everyone has a nice Easter Holiday. Gordon Pickerd, VP, will lead the April meeting. I hope to be fishing in some warmer weather

On Saturday, April 25th, 2015 we're creating rabbit habitat (rabbitat) at the Crane Pond State Game Area. Join us for rabbitat restoration by cutting invasive species of trees and using them to construct large brush piles.

Using large, criss-crossed logs as the base of the pile and placing finer brush from treetops or shrubs on top generally works the best. Brush piles should be at least 15 feet across and 5 feet tall and should be spaced about 20-50 feet apart. Constructing these brush piles is actually a written part of Crane Pond State Game Area's cottontail-rabbit management plan!

Chainsaws will be helpful with adequate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and experience. We will have three extra full sets of sawyer PPE to provide, as well as gloves, safety glasses, and ear plugs. We will also have extra handsaws and loppers for volunteers to use.

Lunch will be provided by MUCC after the event. Volunteers will also receive their choice of a free Green & White or Maize & Blue OTG T-shirt as part of the <u>Spartan-Wolverine Challenge</u>, well as a free digital subscription to Michigan OutofDoors Magazine.

All RSC CMP Military Rifle matches are open to the Public. RSC is a CMP-Affiliated Club, but these are not CMP/NRA "registered" shoots.

League fees cover all five shoots for one class (Semi-Auto or Bolt).

The entry fee includes a CMP Membership Card and Qualification Letter, which entitles the holder to purchase firearms, parts, and ammo directly from CMP.

Standard "As Issued" military rifles with iron or peep sights (no optics) (e.g. M1-A1, M-1 Garands, M-1 Carbines, SKS, AK-47, AR-15, Springfields, Mausers, Enfields, Nagants, Krags, etc). Rifles may be available for use and ammo or chamber flags for purchase with advance notice.

Relays will be fired during each match based on both Course A (30 rds, 3-position @ 100 yds, SR-1 targets) and Course B (40 rds, 4-position @ 200 yds, SR targets). Each course will be preceded with (5) sighters.

Classes will include Semi-Auto and Bolt Action, Large and Small Bore. Other classes may be added as determined by the CMP committee. League shooters may fire both Semi-Auto and Bolt for the same League entry, but will compete in Semi-Auto class. One or more awards will be given for each class depending on the number of shooters.

Scores will be recorded, with the winners based on highest average score for the five (5) matches. Ties will be decided first by most "x"'s, then by a ten (10) round Slow Fire, Standing shoot-off if needed, or other determinate as agreed by the parties. 
