Invocation was given by Tim Hall.

#### Jennifer German

Manager of K branch of KDL. Thanks for yearly donation which helps support education. Howard Christenson is interested in putting on a program at the middle schools. An interactive program idea was fielded. Conversation Olympics was proposed. Class room sized programs would be the target. The two programs plus a summer reading program at the library would cost \$1,200. KDL is ready move forward. Teachers would prefer bussing if possible. This would be paid for by the wildlife encounter money. Their was a motion to approve the \$1,200 which was carried.

## **Bob Anaya**

Retired state police officer who is involved with Kent County Marine. Wants to put on two programs which would require a \$15 donation. This program would be ORV safety and boater's safety. May  $25^{th}$  and  $18^{th}$  from 9am-1pm. The  $18^{th}$  is a conflict with CMP. May  $11^{th}$  was proposed instead. Instead it was decided to schedule for May  $1^{st}$  and  $18^{th}$ . Motion made by Gordon. Seconded by Dan. Motion carried.

#### **Neil Schaefer**

Wants to bring the NRL 22Ir series to Rockford. This would be more of an action shoot. The targets would include steel. A suggestion was made this would be safe as the bullets are 22Ir are not jacketed. A discussion was held about the height of the targets to facilitate them hitting the berm. This conversation will be continued in the committee. Gordy made a motion to carry this conversation to committee. Dan seconds. Motion carried.

#### **Steve Gardner**

Rimfire budget was incorrect. Need more money for door prizes. Steve has reached out to over 12 new sponsors and had some responses already. Asking for up to \$350 for door prizes. Also asking for \$130 for a new shot timer. This would decrease the amount collected for the club to around \$900. The timer should be charged to the club, not the event. Dan suggested purchasing the timer and submitting for reimbursement. Dan makes a motion to increase the budget by \$350. Jim seconded. Motion carried.

#### .President's Report: Ryan Cordes

Spring clean-up in two weeks. No replies yet on specific projects. Working from 8-2 and hopefully burning brush after.

Cowboy shoot this month had 11 shooters with three claiming to members. Yet to see any money from the cowboy shoots. Invited the chair person to this board meeting but no one showed. Nathan did send an update to the activity page. There is a question if there is a member involved in cowboy shooting. Len stated historically the payments have been slow but does show up. This will be discussed with Chuck.

### **Vice President's Report:**

Asked if there has been any action on the land purchase. The sellers dropped to \$8000 but we are still at \$4000 and we may be too far apart. Asked if we might be able to provide donation slip for incentive. It is believed the owner paid \$5000 for this land.

March 30<sup>th</sup> the Rockford team will shoot here. Recently added a 25<sup>th</sup> member to the team. Dr. Shibler. Expecting a grant from Michigan National Guard of \$1500. They want to pay through pay pal. \$7000 in sponsored money so far. Current cost per shooter is \$1000. Looking to increase each shooter from 2 to three lines every Sunday. This would increase the total cost from around \$1100 to around \$1700. Need to make sure all people closing down practice are trained in proper procedure.



How Rep Justin Amash voted on HR 8 universal background checks.

A comment was made at the March 5 member meeting that Rep Justin Amash voted for the Universal Background Check Bill. Rep Amash has been a pro gun representative so that didn't seem right. I checked the Congressional Records and found that he voted AGAINST the Background Check bill. However, he did vote for the last minute amendment requiring the FBI to notify ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) any time an legal or illegal alien attempts to buy a firearm using the background check system. 26 Democrats also voted for the amendment even though Nancy Pelosi and the Democratic leadership didn't want it. The amendment was a "poison pill" intended to embarrass the Democratic leadership and reduce support for the bill in the Senate. It contradicts their so-called support of immigrants.

I also did a quick check on Federal gun laws and aliens. It is obviously illegal for an illegal immigrant to buy or own a firearm, PERIOD NO EXCEPTIONS. Only an immigrant having permanent resident status can legally buy a firearm under Federal law. . An immigrant with a student or work visa cannot buy a firearm. Such a person attempting to buy commits a felony and would be subject to immediate arrest and deportation. State laws vary but in general

# 2019 Rockford Sportsman's Club Hunter Safety Classes

Dates and Times.

April class: Monday 4/8 from 6:00 to 8:30 pm

Wednesday 4/10 from 6:00 to 8:30 pm Saturday 4/13 from 9:00am to 5:00 pm..

July class: Monday 7/22 from 6:00 to 8:30 pm

Wednesday 7/24 from 6:00 to 8:30 pm Saturday 7/27 from 9:00am to 5:00 pm..

September class: Monday 9/23 from 6:00 to 8:30 pm

Wednesday 9/25 from 6:00 to 8:30 pm Saturday 9/28 from 9:00am to 5:00 pm..

Students must attend all three class sessions to receive their certificate.

Students completing the DNR on-line hunter safety course only need to attend the Saturday session as the Field Day.

The cost for the class is \$10.00. A donation of \$5.00 maximum is also requested to help defray the cost of the hot dog and chips lunch served on Saturday.

There is no minimum age requirement for taking the course. However, students 10 years old or younger must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Parents or relatives are invited to attend the class with their children. There is no additional charge for sitting in on the class.

The club is located at 11115 Northland Drive, north of Rockford on Northland Drive between 13 Mile Rd and M-57

The class can accommodate physically challenged people. We do ask for advance notice so that we can prepare or adjust the field sessions on Wednesday and Saturday. The Department of Natural Resources also gives us guidelines to accommodate dyslexic or ADHD students. If a potential student or parent has any questions they can contact Bill Skallos.

### CLASS DESCRIPTION

The Monday evening session has introductions, safety videos and a question & answer session. Wednesday evening covers treestands and students do a little 3D archery outdoors. Saturday morning has firearms review, outdoor firearm and crossbow range demonstrations. In the afternoon the students have small group sessions: .22 and shotgun shooting, firearms handling, blood trail exercise, preparedness and first aid. A conservation officer comes in to talk about the legal aspects of hunting. The students then take the multiple choice test. We grade the tests as they are handed in, the students receive their cards once we check their tests.
