RSC GATE PROJECT

October 13, 2020

I. Current Situation

- A) An automated gate has been a discussion item for several years with the long term planning committee and is currently on the project list.
 - a) Gate replacement is a budgeted carry over project from prior years (\$4,400)
 - b) Automation & electronic monitoring as a strategic project within the next couple of years
- B) Existing gate is in need of repair and is not suitable for automation
- C) There is interest in replacement of the current gate with an automated system. (A group of members solicited & presented the proposal at the September Members meeting)

II. Background - Automated Gate Design

Automated gates are made up 3 different modules. The gate, the operator and the control system

- A) Gate styles: barrier, swing and slide Gates are custom to each application
- B) Operator design all appear to have battery backup/solar charging options
 - 1) barrier gearbox/crank
 - 2) swing linear actuator or gearbox/crank designs
 - 3) Sliding gearbox/roller chain
- C) Control systems options cover the range of Homelink garage door sender/receiver to sophisticated keypad/card entry with computerized data collection.

III. Cedar Springs Fence Proposal (\$5,750)

- A) Custom 24' L 4' H counter balanced cantilevered chain link sliding gate
- B) Gearbox/roller chain operator
- C) Basic keypad control with storage of the last entry by each code

IV. RSC Assessment

- A) Current gate needs repair & is not suitable for automation
- B) Automation, reliability and maintenance requirements are key elements for a replacement gate
- C) Replacement goals
 - 1) need to protect the family membership nature & image of the club
 - 2) accommodate emergency services access (police/fire/ambulance)
 - 3) allow event public entry while capturing historical membership access
 - 4) ability to operate during a power outage
 - 5) be operable manually without automation

V. Recommendation

The board approved replacement of the current gate with a manual swing gate suitable for automation, The automation of the gate is on a recommended project list for next year.


